Entry Requirements for International Students Policy

1. Enrolment Application Process

- (a) Brisbane Boys' College will consider enrolment applications from students wishing to apply for a Student Visa, subject to compliance with minimum requirements and conditions set by the College, and with legislative requirements of the State of Queensland and the Commonwealth of Australia, including any requirements to undertake extra tuition to learn English to meet the English language proficiency standard needed to enter mainstream classes.
- (b) Applications for enrolment must be made by either completing the Brisbane Boys' College online Enrolment Form available on the Brisbane Boys' College website at: https://bbc.digistormenrol.com.au/applications/enrolment or by completing the Brisbane Boys' College International Student Application for Enrolment form which can be downloaded from the Brisbane Boys' College website at: https://www.bbc.qld.edu.au/join-us/international-admissions/. An International Student Application for Enrolment form can also be requested by contacting Student Admissions at admissions@bbc.qld.edu.au. The application for enrolment must be correctly completed, and must be accompanied by the following documents to support the application:
 - (i) Copies of Student Report Cards from the previous two (2) years of study (if applicable), including a copy of the latest Student Report;
 - (ii) A completed Reference Form from the student's current or most recent school Principal is also required if student Report Cards do not record student behaviour or commitment to studies;
 - (iii) A completed Subject Choices Form if appropriate;
 - (iv) Appropriate proof of identity and age;
 - (v) Written evidence of proficiency in English as a second language
 - (vi) Photocopy or scanned copy of passport page with name, photo identification, passport number and expiry date
 - (vii) Letter of Offer from another registered provider if applicable
 - (viii) Completed Boarding Application Form
 - (ix) Enrolment Application Fee
 - (x) Application to the Queensland Assessment and Curriculum Authority QCAA) for relaxation of completed Core requirements if applicable.
- (c) Where the above documents are not in English, certified translations in English are required, with necessary costs to be met by the applicant.

- (d) An application for enrolment can only be processed when all of the above have been provided to Student Admissions.
- (e) Applications from international students are processed according to established policy and procedures and are dealt with on their merits
- (f) Assessment procedures include an evaluation of reports from previous schools and of English language proficiency. In cases where report cards are not available or are inconclusive for any reason, the College may require relevant testing of the applicant to assess the application.
- (g) Onshore applications for Years 11-12, where the student is transferring from another CRICOS registered provider, will only be considered where the transfer, if accepted, allows the student to achieve a successful study outcome at the end of the enrolment.
- (h) Offshore applications for enrolment in Years 11-12 will not be considered after the Year 11 course has commenced/ unless the student can complete course assessment before the end of the first semester of Year 11.

Brisbane Boys' College will use this information to assess the suitability of the applicant to undertake the courses for which they have enrolled. It must be noted that following the assessment of an application, the College may recommend a year level other than the year requested on the enrolment application as more appropriate for the student. If this recommendation is accepted by the student/parents, then no change to the College's recommendation will be considered after the student commences.

Students assessed as not meeting the requirements for entry will not be offered confirmed places. Exceptions may be made for students accepted to undertake High School Preparation courses in Brisbane prior to attending Brisbane Boys' College. It is possible to package the English course with the student's primary course of study so that a student visa to cover both courses may be applied for. Brisbane Boys' College requires evidence that the applicant's academic ability and English proficiency is sufficient to successfully meet the entry and curriculum demands of the intended course. This is a requirement under the 2018 National Code of Practice, Part B Standard 2.

Minimum academic and English language requirements are as follows:

2. Academic Requirements

- Applicants are assessed individually based on the contents of their report cards and personal references and may also be required to undertake a language proficiency test set by Brisbane Boys' College.
- 2. Students must provide evidence of satisfactory academic performance appropriate to entry to the year level requested on the Application for Enrolment or offered as an alternative point of entry by the College in a Letter of Offer.
- 3. To be considered for enrolment into the College, students at all entry levels must demonstrate grades equivalent to a pass/C grade or higher over all subjects in school reports provided, unless an Individual Education Plan (IEP) has been provided by the parents and the College has agreed to relax minimum course requirements and provide educational support not accessible in the student's country of origin. Such IEPs may carry additional course costs which will be discussed with each family prior to offering a place at the College.

3. English Language Proficiency Requirements

- 1. Where English is not the student's first language, students must demonstrate a satisfactory result in an approved English proficiency assessment taken within the past six months; and where English is being studied as an academic subject at their current school, a pass of 75% or higher is generally required. Students may be required to undertake a language proficiency test set by the College.
- If supplied, Brisbane Boys' College will assess evidence of English language proficiency
 presented by a student at the time of application however reserves the right to confirm the
 student's English language proficiency through additional diagnostic testing.
- 3. If not presenting appropriate evidence of English language proficiency at the time of application, Brisbane Boys' College will assess the student's application for entry based on satisfactory English language proficiency test results as follows:

- Where certificates of results for an accepted assessment of English proficiency are submitted with enrolment forms (e.g. IELTS, ISLPR or TOEFL), these certificates must be certified original documents unless provided directly to the College via the testing authority (e.g. AEAS assessment).
- Students should note that if their language proficiency is below that outlined above, they may be required to undertake an intensive English language course before beginning mainstream studies.
- 3. Where EAL support has been listed as a condition of offer, additional testing will be completed following commencement to determine the frequency and structure of support to be provided.

4. Course Credit

Brisbane Boys' College will assess all applications for course credit for students enrolling in Senior Secondary Studies.

The student may receive course credit for units completed based on evidence provided of studies undertaken under the relevant state or territory curriculum assessment authority or nationally accredited framework.

Brisbane Boys' College assesses and records course credit, according to requirements of the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA).
