The BBC Cricket program is based on site at Brisbane Boys' College in Toowong.

Vacancies exist for experienced coaches across the GPS Cricket program. We provide an opportunity for our boys to develop both in Cricket skills and strategies, as well as athletically, in a setting that encourages individual and team participation and achievement.

The BBC Cricket season commences in Term 4 (early October) and finishes at the end of Term 1 (end of March). BBC boys break for Christmas holidays in December and return to school on 28 January. The BBC Cricket week (training/trials) will operate from 20 January – 24 January 2020 in preparation for the upcoming season.

During Term 4, each year level trains at different frequencies, times and days during the week. In Term 1, training times will include at least two sessions and a Saturday match each week during the GPS season.
