Working with students from Years 7 to 10 across the Middle and Senior School Technology KLA program, you will be empowered to create and deliver engaging, flexible, and intellectual learning experiences that challenge and inspire the boys in our programs. You will also be actively engaged in the College's Co-curricular and Student Wellbeing and Positive Education programs.

Brisbane Boys' College is an established GPS day and boarding school. The school was founded in 1902 by Mr Arthur Rudd, who had a vision of moulding boys to be worthy leaders and good citizens – a vision which remains today. The College occupies a 13 hectare site four kilometres from the centre of Brisbane and educates students from Prep to Year 12.

Position requirements and description

This position requires that you hold registration, or eligibility for registration, as a teacher in Queensland.

You will be required to:

- Teach courses that address National Curriculum and QCAA Applied content within the Technology KLA.
- Demonstrate a willingness to design and use technologies across a range of Technology contexts.
- Demonstrate innovative thinking around the process and production skills needed by 21st Century learners.
- Have a working knowledge of the latest industry-relevant CAD packages and 3D prototyping techniques.
- Design and implement intellectually challenging learning experiences that value diversity and utilise information technology as a tool for learning.
- Assess and report constructively on student learning.
- Support personal development and participation in society.
- Create and maintain safe and supportive learning environments particularly in relation to behaviour management aimed at building positive and authentic relationships with students.
- Foster positive and productive relationships with students, families, staff, and the community.
- Be actively involved in the College's Co-curricular program.
- Be actively involved in the College's Student Wellbeing and Positive Education programs.
- Commit to reflective practice and ongoing professional renewal.
- Be positive in support of the College's traditions and Christian ethos.
- Perform conscientiously and competently the duties, teaching and non-teaching, as assigned by the Headmaster or delegate.
